The Cantata, op. 42 was written during the winter months of 1947-48 for performance at the Centenary Celebration of Lancing College, Sussex, on July 24, 1948. Written to words by his close friend, Eric Crozier, SAINT NICOLAS was conceived in a period when Britten was receiving international acclaim as an opera composer. Each of the nine movements of the work is intensely dramatic and paints a descriptive account of the life and legend of the most popular saint in all of Christendom.

- I. The <u>Introduction</u> takes place in the present. The orchestra, representing the passage of time in a strict ostinato manner, suggests through use of exotic Eastern modal harmonies that Nicolas is patron saint of Russia, Greece and Syria. Nicolas appears to us from the past and reminds us of our Christian heritage for which many saints have died. "Yet still their shining seed of faith survives in you...for faith was won by centuries of sacrifice and many martyrs died, that you might worship God." The chorus offers a prayer asking God to strengthen us and to teach us to serve Him with simplicity.
- II. The children sing of the <u>Birth of Nicolas</u> and of his extraordinary abilities, innocence, and faith as a young man, a parallel to the Holy Christ Child.
- III. Nicolas devotes himself to God after his parents die. "I called to God to purge my angry soul, to be my only Master, Friend and Guide. I begged for sweet humility, and love was satisfied."
- IV. He journeys to Palestine. On his voyage to the Holy Land, Nicolas is confronted with the sinful nature of the sailors and their lack of faith. The rages of a violent storm bring the sailors to their knees in prayer. Nicolas offers a prayer in the midst of the tribulation, and soon the storm subsides and the sea is again calm. The incident reminds us that Nicolas is the patron saint of sailors and travelers.
- V. He comes to Myra and is chosen Bishop. The symbolism of the Bishop's vestments is described by the Gallery Chorus: the mitre to show mastery of men; the golden robe that covers with Christ's authority; the Cross of Faith; the crosier that serves as a staff to the flock; the ring that is the sacramental sign of wedlock
