Odysseus and the Sirens

H. Garrett Phillips

The story of "Odysseus and the Sirens" is found in Homer's epic poem, the *Odyssey*, which recounts the adventures of Odysseus on his way home to Ithaca after the Trojan War. One of the many perils encountered by Odysseus and his crew were the sirens, creatures said to be half woman, half bird, who enticed seamen by the sweetness of their song to such a degree that listeners forgot everything and died of hunger. Following the advice of the sorceress Circe, Odysseus sailed past the sirens without danger by putting wax in his men's ears. He had himself tied to the mast, however, so that he could enjoy their song.

Urok

Lojze Lebič b. 1934

Lojze Lebič, a contemporary composer living in Ljubljana, Slovenia, uses a variety of avant garde choral techniques in this recent work. The text is evidently based on a magic spell to be used against bewitchment or perhaps to drain off the venom of snake bite. The piece is set as a tone picture, a blend of sung and spoken sounds employing superstitious folk incantations to invoke a feeling of primitive mystery. It begins with a strong opening statement, followed by softly muttered exhortations, presumably over an animal sacrifice:

Take the marrow from the bone! Tear apart the flesh! Tear off the fur!

One is then instructed to go to where the grass grows green, by the rye field, and bury them "nine elbows deep in the ground." The voices build, puntuated by sharp cries and rhythmic tapping of sticks and stones, then open into a chant in the style of a folk song:

For those who look white, black, or mottled; For those who look red or green; For those who are deaf or mute; You must take this against poison -[and chant] 'Bad blood, begone!'

The piece culminates in cascading sound, with each singer improvising on a given piece of the text.

A wickedly lively rendition of the French Canadian favorite, with singers providing percussion.

The Peninsula Women's Chorus has earned a national and international reputation as one of the finest women's choirs in the United States. The Chorus specializes in serious music for women's voices from the medieval through contemporary periods, performed in the original languages and from memory. Established in 1966 by founder and director Marjorie Rawlins, the Chorus performs extensively throughout the Bay Area. The Chorus has been broadcast on National Public Radio and has appeared on television both nationally and internationally. The Chorus has made three overseas concert tours: in 1981 to Austria, Germany, and Switzerland; in 1984 to Great Britain, where they participated in the International Eisteddfod in Llangollen, Wales, and appeared on BBC television; and in the summer of 1994 to Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Estonia, and Latvia, during which they won second prize at the Tallinn International Choral Competition. The Chorus performed at the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) National Convention in San Antonio, Texas, in 1987, singing a feature concert of music from the film, Song of Survival. In March of 1992, they performed at the ACDA Western Division Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, and in 1993, the Chorus was selected by jury to perform on the main venue at the ACDA National Convention in San Antonio. In October 1995, PWC and director Patricia Hennings made their highly successful operatic debut in the West Bay Opera production of Puccini's Suor Angelica. The Chorus has released two CDs, "Treasures" and "Alleluia Psallat," and will soon release "Songs of the Spirit," which features several of the pieces from this program.

Patricia Hennings, Director

Patricia Hennings, director of the Peninsula Women's Chorus since 1975, has directed the PWC in three appearances at ACDA regional and national conventions and is active as a clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Pomona College, and Masters and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from Stanford University. She is a member of Sigma Alpha Iota, a professional women's music organization, and has received the fraternity's Sword of Honor and Rose of Honor. As Director of Choral Activities at Skyline College, she conducts the Skyline College Choir and the Skyline Chorus and teaches a humanities course in art and music. She served as national chairperson of women's choirs from 1990 to 1993 for the American Choral Directors Association. In February 1998 she conducted the first Women's Honor Choir for the ACDA Western Division.

Josephine Gandolfi, Pianist JS

Josephine Gandolfi joined the Peninsula Women's Chorus as pianist in 1992 and contributes to the PWC's innovative programming. As soloist and accompanist to singers, she has performed in Europe, Israel, and many parts of the United States. She was the recipient of Fulbright grants for the study of vocal accompanying, solo piano, and chamber music. She has been a member of the piano faculties of Stanford University and the University of California at Santa Cruz, and has held the position of coach-accompanist at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. She has recorded for CRI, Koch International, New Albion, Radio Bremen, and Sender Freies Berlin.
