





Featured Composers



Composer, conductor, and music educator Agneta Sköld was born and raised in Västerås, Sweden. She studied at the Royal College of Music in Stockholm, and in 1998 was appointed Swedish Choir Leader of the Year. Sköld's buoyant, dance-like "Gloria" features cascading lines and unexpected harmonic shifts, with a highly contrasting *et in terra pax* (peace on earth) section that layers rippling tone clusters over a markedly rhythmic text.

In Terra Pax - Marek Jasiński

Polish composer Marek Jasiński was born in Stargard Szczeciński in 1949. He studied composition and conducting at the State Higher School of Music in Poznań and at the Poznań Academy, from which he graduated in 1979. He then began a career as composer and academic teacher, first at the Sczcecin Branch of the Poznań Music Academy, and from 1995 at the Bydgoszcz Music Academy, where he became a professor in 1999. He has received numerous awards for his compositions. Though his works include symphonic compositions and chamber music, the majority are sacred choral works.

"In Terra Pax" alternates between somber minor sections, with sustained chords creating a sense of tension, and lighthearted major motives. Neither of these moods is self-contained, however; as the sections rapidly shift, somber hints infiltrate the lighthearted sections and vice versa, intertwining to offer a possible glimpse into Jasiński's perspective on "peace on earth" as a native of Eastern Europe.

Gloria Kajoniensis - Gyöngyösi Levente

Hungarian composer Gyöngyösi Levente was born in 1975. "Gloria Kajoniensis" is an unorthodox Gloria in that it is based on texts from the "Cantionale Catholicum," a collection of Transylvanian Catholic songs collected and edited in 1676.

Scored for two violins, bongo, tambourine, and chorus, this gypsyesque "Gloria" follows unusual melodic scales influenced by Hungarian music. An explosive "Gloria!" opens the piece, giving way to a fiery violin duet. Gyöngyösi's percussive, syncopated rhythms drive the piece through sections of contrasting texture and mood to its ecstatic ending. Grace notes, slides, and other ornaments in the vocal and violin parts underscore the earthy, almost jazzy nature of this celebratory setting.

Tundra - Ola Gjeilo

Ola Gjeilo was born in Norway in 1978, and graduated from the Juilliard School in 2006 with a master's degree in composition. Presently a full-time composer based in New York City, Gjeilo is also interested in film, and his style draws much inspiration from movies and cinematic music. "Tundra" was commissioned and composed in 2011 for the American Choral Director's Association Women's Commission Consortium, based on lyrics written by Charles Anthony Silvestri specifically for this work.

I asked Tony to write a text based on the title, "Tundra," and some photos of a part of my native Norway that is very dear to me: the Hardangervidda mountain plateau, close to where my father grew up, in the ski resort town called Geilo, in the mountains between Oslo and Bergen. Hardangervidda is Europe's largest mountain plateau, and a large part of it is tundra (areas where the subsoil is permafrost, or permanently frozen soil/Treeless plain). This area is quite barren, and intensely beautiful. It is easy to feel that you are treading on sacred land, which Tony so wonderfully expresses in his text.

In the music, I wanted to emphasize the slight monotony of the

landscape with a steady and quite repetitive (pattern-wise) piano part, in a kind of post-minimalist style. The choir material is comprised mainly of chord "pads" and an atmospheric melody. The little soprano solos scattered around the piece are meant more as colorings, an obbligato, than a melodic focal point.

Joy - John Muehleisen

John Muehleisen specializes in works for choir and solo voice. He is a graduate of California State University, Sacramento and the University of Washington, where he studied composition with William Bergsma, William O. Smith, and Diane Thome. Since 1996, he has served as Composerin-Residence and Artistic Advisor for the Seattle-based Opus 7 Vocal Ensemble.

"Joy" is based on a combination of two texts by the turn-of-thecentury American poet Sara Teasdale (1884 - 1933), who was the first recipient in 1918 of the Columbia University Poetry Society Prize (which later became the Pulitzer Prize for poetry). The first two stanzas of "Joy" are comprised of the poem of the same name from her 1915 collection titled Rivers to the Sea, while the balance of the text is the poem "To Joy" from the 1907 collection Sonnets to Duse and Other Poems. Both present an enraptured, almost manic portrait of love and its redemptive, healing powers. Given our understanding of Teasdale's on-and-off love life, these poems are likely autobiographical. I was particularly struck by the opening of the first poem: "I am wild," which must have been seen as a bold statement from a female poet during the strife-filled days of the American suffragette movement, although its utterance was likely made possible by that very movement. I chose to hyper-focus on that text in the opening to heighten the manic mood, and I also repeated it a short while later, this time in an obsessive ostinato, which underlies the more lyrical, joyful utterance, "I have heart-fire and singing to give..." I was attracted to these texts because they represent an ecstatic, joyous mood not present in many of Teasdale's poems, which tend toward a more somber tone, reflecting love lost rather than gained. In contrast to the tragic suicide that ended Teasdale's life, both the poem and the work end with a sense of serenity and peace and a tone of deep spiritual satisfaction born of the joy derived from the memory of the "one great height" described near the end of the poem.

Winter, Snow - Carol Barnett

Carol Barnett (b. 1949) has had a longtime presence on the Minnesota music scene. She is a charter member of the American Composers Forum and a graduate of the University of Minnesota, where she studied composition with Dominick Argento and Paul Fetler. Commissioned in 2004, Winter, Snow is a dramatic setting of a poem by British poet Edward Thomas, bookended with spare winter imagery penned by Barnett herself. Thomas (1878 – 1917) was a friend of Robert Frost's and drew on a love of nature to inspire his poetry.

"Winter, Snow" opens with shimmering chords in the upper register that evoke the sparkle of sunlight on ice. The middle section, which is the setting of Thomas's poem, unfolds into a lilting, melancholy waltz before returning to the chords of the opening theme. Darkness gives way to "bright, bright light" once again as the melody climbs to its peak.

Dr. Martín Benvenuto, Artistic Director

Martín Benyenuto is one of the leading treble choir conductors in the San Francisco Bay Area and beyond. A native of Buenos Aires, Argentina, he has been Artistic Director of the Peninsula Women's Chorus (PWC) since 2003. Active as a clinician, panelist, and guest conductor. Benyenuto is also Artistic Director of WomenSing (WS), has served on the faculty of the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir for eight years, and has recently been appointed Artistic Director of the Contra Costa

Recognized for his exacting technique, and a passion for drawing the finest choral tone, Benvenuto's

repertoire is extensive. In addition to the historical repertoire, his choirs are dedicated to commissioning new works from composers such as Libby Larsen, Chen Yi, Stacy Garrop, Charles Griffin, Cristián Grases, Judith Shatin, Frank Ferko, Brian Holmes, and David

His choirs have earned high marks in international competitions in Argentina, South Africa, Canada, Hungary, and Spain. Of particular note are the Third Prize awarded to the PWC at the 2006 Béla Bártok International Choir Competition, one of the most prestigious in the European circuit, the 2010 Chorus America/ASCAP Alice Parker award, which recognized WomenSing for programming recently- composed music that expanded the mission of the chorus, and the PWC's second place in the 2011 American Prize in Choral Performance, which recognizes and rewards the best recordings by choruses in the U.S. Benvenuto highly values artistic collaborations: his choirs have collaborated with Veljo Tormis, Joseph Jennings, Karmina Silec and Carmina Slovenica, Charles Bruffy, California Shakespeare Theater, the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus, and the Golden Gate Men's

Benvenuto has prepared choirs for organizations such as the San Francisco Opera, the Oakland East Bay Symphony, the Redwood Symphony, and the Kronos Quartet in works by Bach, Monteverdi, Britten, Mahler, Holst, Stravinsky, and Orff. Benvenuto also regularly appears as tenor soloist with leading Bay Area ensembles.

Benvenuto holds a D.M.A. in choral conducting from Boston University, where he studied with Ann Howard Jones and the late Robert Shaw. He earned his master's degree from Westminster Choir College, majoring both in Choral Conducting and Voice Performance and Pedagogy. His undergraduate degrees in choral conducting and composition are from the Universidad Católica Argentina.

THOMAS ALEXANDER began playing the violin at the age of four after seeing children even younger than him playing with Suzuki groups in San Diego. He studied the Suzuki method with Janet Gastil through high school and later graduated from UCSD with a degree in violin performance, where he studied with János Négyesy and Carol Plantamura. Since moving to San Francisco, Thomas has performed throughout the Bay Area with a variety of chamber groups and local community orchestras. He has served as concertmaster for the Symphony Parnassus and Silicon Valley Symphony and is currently concertmaster of the San Francisco Civic

ANDREA OEY, violinist, is a native New Yorker with degrees from the Juilliard School, Oberlin College and Conservatory, and the Mannes College of Music. She has performed throughout world, most notably with the Spoleto Festival Orchestra (Italy), Key West Symphony and Sarasota Opera Orchestra (Florida), Holder's Festival with the Lyric Orchestra (Barbados), MMCK Orchestra (Japan), the Bangkok Symphony (Thailand), and the Singapore Symphony Orchestra. Besides classical repertoire, Ms. Oey has played acoustic violin with the jazz funk group, Ex Caminos, electric violin on New York's Off-Broadway show, Heat Lightning, and solo

violin and quartet playing for numerous recordings for commercials and independent films. She has appeared in concert with U2's Bono, Luciano Pavarotti, k.d. lang, Quincy Jones, Patrizio Buanne, and Slumdog Millionaire and Bollywood composer, A.R. Rahman. A dedicated instructor, Ms. Oey also teaches violin at the Musically Minded Academy in Rockridge, CA and at the University of California at Berkeley Young Musicians Program.

CELESTE EVERSON MISFELDT began studying harp with Marjorie Chauvel of Palo Alto and has played for over forty-five years. She received her Bachelors and Masters degrees from San Francisco State University. She has been a member of several Bay Area groups, including the Nova Vista Symphony, Master Sinfonia, Fremont Symphony, West Bay Opera and California Coast Opera. Her longest musical association is as a member of the Peninsula Symphony, playing continuously since 1974. She has performed with many local ensembles, including the Mission Chamber Orchestra, San Jose Symphony, San Jose Civic Light Opera, Schola Cantorum, Santa Clara Chorale, and numerous area churches. Celeste is a member of the American Harp Society and teaches privately in San Jose.

Jungmee Kim, a native of South Korea, earned her reputation in performing song recital repertoire while studying under several renowned and respected pianists and vocal coaches. Her mentors include Terry Decima, Irma Vallecillo, Susan Larson, and John Moriarty.

Jungmee was named Gideon Klein Scholar for her study of composer Viktor Ullmann and Jewish music in Teresienstadt Camp during the Holocaust. She also received first prize in the Performing Arts Society Beethoven Sonata Competition and a Concord Pavilion Performing Arts Scholarship.

A highly sought-after musician, she keeps a busy performance schedule as a solo pianist, collaborative pianist, organist, and percussionist. She has appeared with Boston Philharmonic Orchestra, Harvard University Wind Ensemble, Boston Opera Collaborative, Northeastern University Orchestra, Prism Opera, New England Conservatory Light Opera Company, Harvard Business Music Series, Longy School of Music, Bay Area Classical Harmonies, Oakland Opera Theatre, and Palo Alto Philharmonic Orchestra. Jungmee has also premiered numerous compositions by New England based composers.

Jungmee is the music director and répétiteur for the San Francisco Parlor Opera; recent projects include Thaïs, Madame Butterfly, Così fan tutte, Agrippina, Follies, Le nozze di Figaro, Amahl and the Night Visitors, Hänsel und Gretel and Les contes d'Hoffmann.

She has an M.M. from the New England Conservatory of Music, an M.L.A from Harvard University, and a B.A. from Northeastern University.

THE PENINSULA WOMEN'S CHORUS

The Peninsula Women's Chorus, established in 1966, is a leader in resurgence in women's choirs specializing in choral masterpieces. The PWC is known for its adventurous programming, seeking out music written specifically for women, and frequently commissioning new works. The singers are selected by audition and share an enthusiasm for challenging repertoire sung in original languages. Among PWC honors are second place in the American Prize for Choral Performance for its 2010 CD Nature Pictures, third prize in the 2006 Béla Bartók 22nd International Choir Competition, women's division, in Debrecen, Hungary; two Chorus America/ASCAP Awards for Adventurous Programming (2003 and 1999); finalist in the 2000 Margaret Hillis award for Choral Excellence. and second prize at the 1994 Tallinn International Choral Competition in Estonia. The chorus has made three appearances at ACDA National Conventions - first in 1987, singing a feature concert of the vocal orchestra music from the film, Song of Survival, and presenting music for women's voices in a special interest session of music by Kirke Mechem; in 1993, presenting a traditional choral program; and in March of 2001, presenting a contemporary tour de force before more than 6,000 choral directors to great acclaim. In addition, the chorus performed as a continental founding choir at the AmericaFest World Festival of



Women's Singing in Seattle in July of 2001. The PWC has participated in many choral competitions and festivals: in 2011, the PWC was selected to participate in the Seghizzi International Competition of Choral Singing in Gorizia, Italy; in the summer of 2003, participated, as one of four choirs representing the United States, in Festival 500: Sharing the Voices, an international festival of choral music in St. John's, Newfoundland. In addition to extensive performing throughout the San Francisco Bay Area, the chorus has performed on National Public Radio, and has appeared on television both nationally and internationally.


NATURE PICTURES

Influenced by his deep conviction that ancient song traditions reflect a close connection to nature, the prolific Tormis gives us the four seasons in 36 miniatures of intense choral imagery in his evocative song cycle, Looduspildid (Nature Pictures). WINTER PATTERNS



CAROLS and LULLABIES


